- ☐ Hunt for a rare find at Battlesbridge Antique Centre
- ☐ Visit the Motorcycle Museum at Battlesbridge
- ☐ Enjoy some refreshment at The Crouch Valley Brewery, South Woodham Ferrers
- ☐ Get amongst nature at Marsh Farm Country Park
- ☐ Stroll around the gardens at Hyde Hall
- ☐ Look for Brent Geese, oystercatchers, kestrels at the Essex Wildlife Trust Reserve, Blue House Farm, North Fambridge
- ☐ From Althorne station take a short self-guided nature ramble through Bass Wood and along the seawall
- ☐ See the yachts on the quayside at Burnham on Crouch and visit the unique Clock Tower
- ☐ Jump aboard the ferry to Wallasea Island to see seals basking on the mudflats, a plethora of native and migrant bird species and butterflies
- ☐ Find your favourite real ale pub at Southminster
- ☐ Take the bus from Southminster to Bradwell on Sea and walk to Cockle Spit beach, home to the mystical chapel of St Peter's
- ☐ Take a bike and explore the wonderful scenery of the Dengie Peninsula from Southminster
